

Family & CFCSA

Private lawyers who represent legal aid clients or provide family duty counsel services are paid according to a schedule of hourly or block fees (fixed payments for specified services) and disbursements known as the LABC tariffs.

[Family Duty Counsel](#) refers to lawyers scheduled for specific days and hours that vary by location, providing advice to people representing themselves in family law (including parenting, custody, access, support agreements and protection orders) or child protection proceedings.

[Family LawLINE](#) is a telephone service where family lawyers provide advice about parenting time, custody, access, and support agreements, and child protection proceedings.
